ALLIGATOR SAFETY

Alligators are naturally curious creatures and are often drawn to activity. It's not uncommon for them to swim toward movement or rest along the lagoon embankment. While they may respond to noise, this behavior is not typically aggressive.

As residents of the Low Country—an area that is part of their natural habitat—we strive to coexist peacefully and respectfully with local wildlife.

If you ever notice an alligator crossing onto your property beyond the embankment or displaying signs of aggression, such as hissing, please contact your association manager immediately. In such cases, the alligator may need to be removed and, unfortunately, euthanized, as they cannot be successfully relocated due to a homing instinct that causes them to return.

Thank you for your understanding, and please remain vigilant when spending time near the lagoon. Always keep a close eye on the bank for safety.
